## **Guest Lecture-Capital Markets and Derivatives (25/09/2017):**

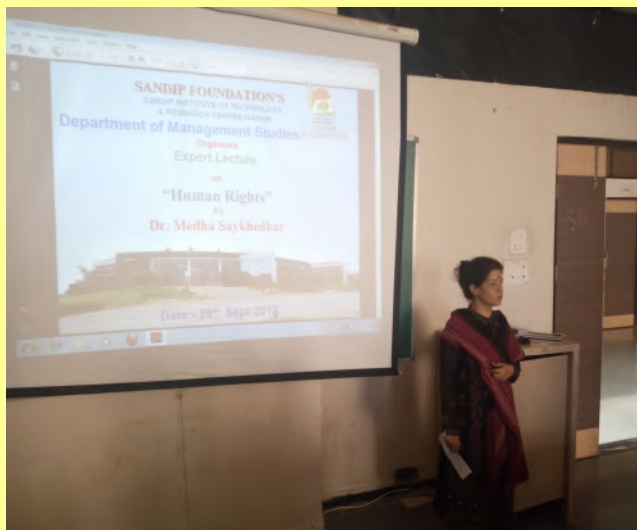
Mr. Tushar Jagtap (CEO) Money market Systems, Nashik have delivered lecture on Capital Markets and Derivatives.
